

Rules

1. The classes are open to all residents of Narborough, Littlethorpe, St Johns and Huncote. Sections 1 and 2 are also open to non-residents who are allotment tenants and members of the NLLGA. Section 2 is also open to non-residents who are members of Narborough & Littlethorpe WI. Section 3 is also open to members of Narborough & Littlethorpe Art class
2. Class 10 Novices is open to anyone eligible to exhibit who has not won a cup in any of our previous shows
3. A maximum of 1 entry per class per person
4. Where applicable, exhibitors must provide their own plates and vases
5. All exhibits must be made or grown by the exhibitor
6. Exhibits must not have been shown in one of our previous shows
7. Exhibits are to be delivered to the hall between 8.30am and 10.00am on the day of the show. The hall will be cleared for judging at 10.00am. Exhibits must be removed after the prize giving and before 4pm
8. The judges' decision is final
9. Narborough Parish Council accepts no responsibility for loss or damage

General Tips for all classes

- Read the rules, hints and tips and timescales
- Where several items are requested, they should be uniformly sized, alike in colour and shape
- Unless specified, large is not always the best
- Do not put your name on any item

Hints and Tips

Section 1 - Garden Produce

- Potatoes - 7/8oz tuber, shallow eyes
- Beetroot - no larger than a tennis ball
- Beans - should have a short stalk attached
- Tomatoes - approx 2.5" diameter, retain calyces
- Apples - should have stalks and not be polished 2.75" diameter
- Soft fruit - should have stalk attached
- Flowers – no foliage from other flowers

Section 2 - Home Produce

- Clean jar, ideally wax disc with clear cellophane cover
- No wax discs are needed under twist tops or plastic tops
- Recycled jars and lids should have NO advertising on
- Commercial lids are not to be used
- All jars should be filled to within 1/8" of the top
- The temperature when sealing the jar should not drop below 82 degrees
- Chutney use screw lids

Wines

- Must be corked, no screw top and in a clear bottle

All baking should be placed on your own plate (no name)

Cakes

- Should be evenly baked, no white specks no wire marks
- Fruit cakes can have a crack on the surface, fruit should be evenly distributed

Fruit Pie

- Fruit must be cooked and pastry when cut must come away cleanly from the plate. Pastry to be on the top and bottom

Bread

- Should be well shaped, characteristic colour, crust uniformly baked. When cut show a fine grain

Section 3 - Handicrafts

- Use a good pattern, even stitches, stuff toys well

Section 4 - Photography

- Keep to the subject matter
- Maximum size 6" x 4" unmounted

Section 5 - Children's

- Must be all their own work
