

Update on byelaws

1. Councillors will recall that the Council approved a revised draft of the proposed byelaws which incorporates changes proposed by our lawyer at its August meeting. As outlined then, the next step was to reconsult on a revised regulatory impacts statement as the changes added new provisions to the draft byelaws.
2. A revised regulatory impacts statement is attached. **Council is asked to approve this and for consultation to take place.**
3. It is proposed to consult via the Council's website and by writing to the local organisations that we consulted in August 2017, allowing 28 days for comment. Draft texts and a list of those organisations is annexed.
4. Following the consultation, the Council will need to consider any representations before finalising the statement of regulatory impacts and submitting the draft byelaws to the Secretary of State.
5. As agreed at the last Council meeting, I have contacted Father Alan Hawker to advise him that the draft byelaws will no longer cover the closed churchyard at All Saints.
