Darker Nights

Op SALIX intends, targeting the anticipated increase in burglary and theft of/from motor vehicle offences due to the night's drawing in. The operation will include a number of different tactical options to attempt to target this offending, including crime prevention advice and equipment. Operation will entail to increase patrols in the highlighted 'at risk' areas during the times and days where historically these offences have occurred. This operation will run from 26 October to 25 November

Public Encouraged to report cases of Modern Slavery

As incidents of modern slavery being reported to Leicestershire Police increase, the force continues to encourage the public to report their concerns.

Latest statistics show the number of occurrences investigated by the force is steadily increasing year on year - in 2015 the force recorded a total of 12 incidents, five years later that figure has risen to 142 reports in the first six months of 2020.

Modern slavery is defined as exploitive behaviour – placing one person in control of another. It can include sexual exploitation, forced labour and domestic servitude.

Our Priorities

1. General ASB at Bradgate Park and Whimpey Park continues to remain the same.
2. We had several reports to ASB in Fosse park area where youths were seen entering into the new building area and intimidating staff and security.
3. Speeding in Narborough and Enderby continues.

Our response

1. Local officers have been patrolling various locations considered ASB hotspots, including local parks and Fosse parks. These patrols have been conducted following your concerns and also to provide some additional reassurance regarding the Covid rules and regulations. The vast majority of individuals have been behaving themselves and there is nothing significant to report at this time.
2. Local officers have been working with Fosse park securities to identify the individuals and regular patrols are being conducted.
3. Traffic calming measures being used in form of police patrol cars and speed operations are deployed in the affected areas.
